TSCM Training

Understanding the Principles of Technical Surveillance Countermeasures

The aim of this two-day course is to provide delegates with the ability to understand and carry out basic physical TSCM surveys. By understanding the principles of TSCM, delegates will be able to conduct interim or very short-notice searches of sensitive areas, in support of a wider counter-espionage strategy.

This classroom-based search course will lead delegates through the physical and technical countermeasures survey process. The course will run through evaluating the threat, producing a survey procedure, conducting a physical and basic electronic inspection, right through to producing a report, complete with recommendations for improving information security.

The course is very much geared towards hands-on experience and involves a number of practical scenarios based within an office environment.

Who should attend?

The course is designed for those involved with security and TSCM operations and is suitable for anyone with the responsibility for securing sensitive sites or information, conducting physical TSCM surveys within their organisation and personnel tasked with employing the services of a third party to conduct TSCM surveys on their behalf.

- ▶ Be able to design a report template
- ▶ Be able to conduct a room search and present findings to the group
- ▶ Be able to consider the issues associated with a technical attack
- ▶ Be able to consider what recommendations could mitigate the threats identified in the exercise.
